2022 School Data – Data is a way that we inform our teaching and we need to not be stagnant.

- o Acadience Reading for Kindergarten through 3rd grade:
 - Proficiency –MOY 79% to EOY 85%
 - Pathways to Progress MOY 64% to EOY 71% proficient
- o Acadience Reading for 4th-6th
 - Proficiency without spectrum MOY 54% to EOY 76%
 - With Spectrum Moy 79% to EOY 88%
 - Pathways to Progress without Spectrum
 MOY 54%- EOY 79%
 - With Spectrum MOY 60% EOY 82%
- o Math Acadience for K-3
 - Scores dipped at the end of the year. This is a new test that teachers are still being trained on.
- School Grades
 - Based on End of Level Testing 3rd-6th grades
 - Looks at our school achievement and growth
 - We have an A!!
- o We met our school improvement goals for last year.

School Business

- Lori Shlegel is our PTA Rep and PTA President. PTA met their fundraising goal and have done so many fun activities with the kids. Movie night and Fun Run were a success.
- We hired a new music teacher
- We hired a new recess duty and a few paraprofessionals within the school have shuffled positions.

- We don't have very many subs available for our school. We can use some community support.
 - Requirements are a high school degree, complete a district orientation, background check. Needs to go through Ms. Killpack.
- Guy Foutz: What should we be mindful of for our school improvement coming up?
 - We need to keep our focus on reading.
 - Professional Learning Communities to look at whole class instruction. We need to make sure that our Tier 1 is strong.
 - Focus on writing and Social Emotional Learning.
 - We may look into implementing an attendance intervention next year after we see what our data is for this year.
- Trustland funds are being used for reading tutors in intervention groups, online programs for math, office and recess help. We will have an influx of money at the end of the year that expires this year.
- We have a new full-time councilor Katie DeGroot. We pay her through CARES and Trustland.
 - The councilor makes groups based on data from the SRSS survey that teachers complete about the students.
 Discipline and referrals are also taken into account.
